ago. Christians follow the teachings of Jesus. They believe that Jesus was the son of God who came to Earth to teach people more about God.

The stories of Jesus's life and teaching are told in the New Testament of the Bible, the Christian holy book. The first four books of the New Testament are called the Gospels and these were written by four early Christians, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
