THE ARTIST and his self-portrait



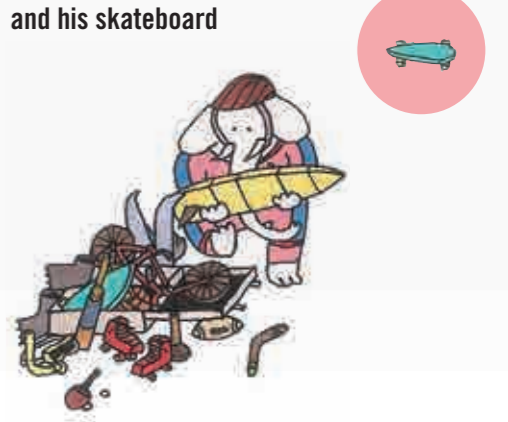

CRUISING THE SUEZ CANAL

MUMBAI → CAIRO

On the journey from Mumbai to Cairo, you and your elephant companions hitch a ride on a huge cargo ship coasting up the Suez Canal. It's a speedy shortcut that means ships can sail between Europe and Asia without travelling all the way round the southern tip of Africa.
