The Cyclops are an ancient race of giants with a single large eye in the middle of their foreheads. They are immensely strong and make thunderbolts for Zeus.



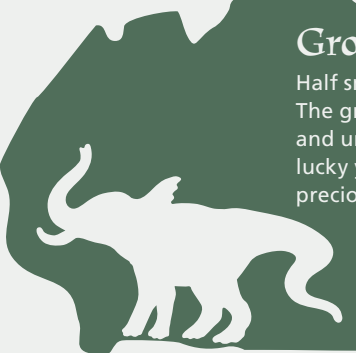
Dragon

Kelpie

Hydra

This many-headed marsh-serpent grows two (or more!) heads for every one cut off, making it nearly impossible to kill.

Grindylow

These creatures slip through the reeds looking for little children who have lost their way and drag them to their doom.

Kraken

This enormous tentacled monster has often been spotted in the frozen seas of the Arctic snacking on whales and dragging ships and sailors to a watery grave.

Loch Ness Monster

Nessie, as the Loch Ness Monster is known to friends, is a gigantic creature that haunts Loch Ness in the Scottish Highlands. If you look closely you might even spot her here in the lagoon!

Frankenstein's Monster
