

















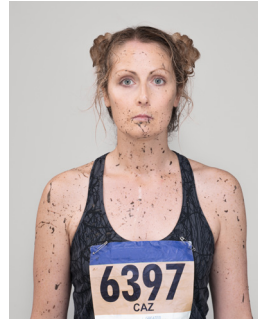






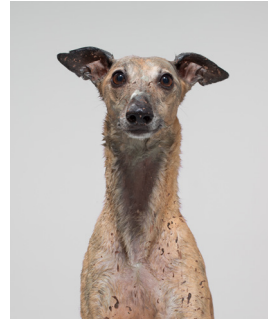


**Meet the

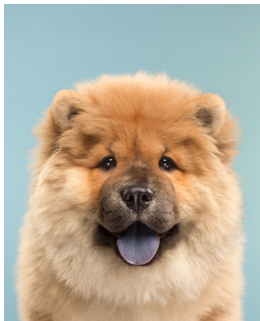
Noodle (Boxer)

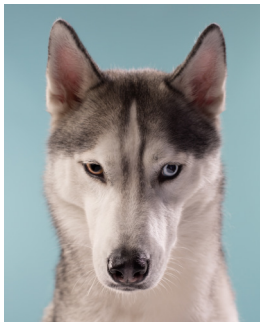
Horst (Schnauzer)
