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




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One day I received a call from a friend of mine, who is the cardiologist of both my parents. As a thank you, my dad gave him the Dadara book "Open Your Mind So We Can Use Your Data" (the predecessor of the book you're reading right now). The title of that book had inspired my friend to write a poem:

"The doctor: Open your life. Open your mind. Open your body. Stop your heart. Open your heart. Close your heart. Restart your heart. Close your body. Open your mind. Restart your life. Happy beginning." He sent me the poem and invited me to visit the hospital, feeling that this would inspire me.

I had just returned from Burning Man, where I was locked up in a big black box for the entire week, and was looking for new inspiration, so I immediately accepted the invitation.

I was introduced to the head of the department. When I mentioned to him that I had been locked up inside a black box for a week, he replied that he himself had just returned from a weeklong dark retreat - a spiritual retreat in a pitch black space, an advanced practice of Tibetan Buddhism. This synchronicity felt like the ideal continuation of the poem and a good reason to explore deeper.

I spent some time in the hospital, learning about the heart and even getting my own heart scanned (to eventually be cast in gold-plated silver). After a few days I was told that I should arrive very early the

next morning to witness an open-heart surgery. I entered the operation room determined not to faint at the sight of the procedure. After a while my friend had to go, leaving me alone. Suddenly, the surgeon performing the operation pointed at me asking "Who is he?"

An awkward silence followed and I had to explain that I am an artist spending some time in the department looking for inspiration. Another awkward silence ensued, and the surgeon asked "So you have no medical knowledge?" I answered that indeed, I had none and he invited me to move closer and watch. It all felt quite uncomfortable until he asked me about my artistic practice. The ice broke when I told him about my Burning Man adventures and the surgeon mentioned that he had been there too. The more we talked, the more connected we became, especially when we realized he was DJ'ing in the nineties, at the same time as I was designing flyers and record covers for the dance scene. We even frequented the same clubs!


To witness an open-heart operation was a mind- and heart-blowing experience. It truly gave me a new way of looking at life. I suppose such an experience is akin to what astronauts experience when viewing our planet from space. To me it felt as if I saw someone (or rather that person's heart) dying and then eventually see that same person come back to life, their heart kickstarted by an electrical impulse. It did indeed open my mind.






# LOADING IOVE TEMPLE


Screens have impacted our art experience for some time already. Nowadays we do not only get to know paintings in museums, galleries, and homes, but often we also find out about and enjoy new art on platforms such as Instagram, Facebook, and Artsy. As NFTs have entered the Artworld, they're not only impacting the way we view art, but also how we perceive the physical ownership of an artwork.

As long as I've been an artist it has always been clear to people that when they or someone else buy one of my paintings, they own it: After all, they can hang it on their wall. Nowadays it puzzles a lot of people why NFTs of artworks are being bought for a lot of money. What do people actually get when they buy an NFT? And what about hanging it on your wall? What's the value of a digital artwork, hanging on the wall of your virtual house in the Metaverse so your Avatar can show it to your virtual friends?

It is fascinating to see that in a world where we're migrating part of our physical existence to the digital realm - meaning that many of us seem to spend more time online than offline - this question is actually not that easy to answer...

We can already choose if we want to go to the cinema or stay on the couch and switch to Netflix to see a movie, or if we're going to a club to listen to our favorite DJ, rather than streaming that DJ set via Soundcloud at a party in our kitchen. Hence, it's actually not that weird to have a choice between a nice trip into town to check some art in the local museum, or have the art come to you in the comfort of your digital home.
