Jill Stone, an American radio journalist who married a Dutchman, has spent the past twenty years carefully curating the perfect Dutch life full of *borrels* (drinks), boats, bikes, and friends in the small idyllic Dutch village of Loenen aan de Vecht, just outside Amsterdam. But it's time for Jill and her family to head to America, fulfilling the agreed-upon plan to spend the next twenty across the Atlantic so they could be closer to Jill's roots, giving her culture and family the attention they deserve.

Everything was going according to plan when Jill got an unexpected job offer, her dream job - as NPR's European Correspondent. Only catch? The job is based in the Netherlands. While Jill wrestles with her decision to move home to America and give up everything she has worked for, husband Paul has an accident, landing him in a medically induced coma. As Paul recovers in the hospital, Jill discovers another surprise, forcing her to question where exactly she fits in — and how her plans for the life she might lead compare to the life she's come to love.

This is a story about the complexities of finding one's place in the world as a dual citizen and highlights the challenges they face when they're too foreign for home, too foreign for the country in which they live, and never enough for both. A comfort read for anyone who has spent a significant amount of time living in a country other than their country of origin.
