This morning, Bayer Healthcare, announced its intention to extend through 2023 its access pricing for a special pill for women living in poor countries around the world. The Reproductive Health Supplies Coalition applauded this move, which will help respond to the growing demand for implant contraceptives worldwide.

"Our Program widens the contraceptive options available to women living in poor countries around the world, so they can choose a method that best suits their needs," said Dieter Weinland, member of the Board of Management of Bayer AG and President of its Pharmaceutical Division.

Two days later in Berlin, Bayer announced that they will halve the price of its contraceptive pill until 2023 for women living in poor countries around the world. According to the Reproductive Health Supply Coalition the demand is increasing continuously in these countries.

Bayer's Program aims to make this underutilized method more affordable and accessible to women there, ultimately helping them to expand their choice of contraceptive options. 'Ensure healthy life's and promote well-being for all at all ages', is one of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) ratified in September 2015 by the United Nations.
