## SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS FOR ADOBE PHOTOSHOP 2026

## GETTING STARTED



### HOW TO DOWNLOAD AND INSTALL THE ADOBE PHOTOSHOP 2026 FREE TRIAL (STEP BY STEP)



This section walks you through **downloading, installing, and safely canceling** the Adobe Photoshop 2026 free trial so you can explore all features without getting charged.

#### Step 1: Go to Adobe's Official Website

Open your web browser and visit **Adobe's official website**.




Sign in with your existing Adobe ID, or create a free account if you don't already have one.




## Step 2: Download Creative Cloud Desktop

Once logged in, download and install the **Adobe Creative Cloud Desktop** application.




Wait for the installation to finish before moving to the next step.




## Step 3: Locate Photoshop in Creative Cloud

After Creative Cloud opens:

1. Click **Apps** on the left-hand menu



2. Find **Photoshop** in the list
3. Click on Photoshop and select **Free Trial**




#### Step 4: Start the Free Trial

Click the **Free Trial** button and choose a subscription plan.

Then click **Continue**.


Important: You **will not be charged immediately**. Adobe only bills you after the trial ends.




## Step 5: Add Payment Information

Even though it's a free trial, Adobe requires you to enter **credit card details**.



- The charge will be **\$0**
- Your card is only used for verification



Once your information is submitted, **Photoshop 2026 begins downloading automatically.**



## Step 6: Use Photoshop During the Trial



- The free trial lasts **7 days**
- You get **full access to all Photoshop 2026 features**
- No limitations during the trial period

## How to Cancel the Adobe Photoshop Free Trial (Avoid Charges)


If you don't plan to subscribe, follow these steps **before the trial ends**.

### Step 7: Sign In to Your Adobe Account


Go back to Adobe's website and log in using the **same Adobe ID** you used to start the trial.

### Step 8: Manage Your Plan

2. Click **Manage Plan**
3. Select **Cancel Your Free Trial**



## Step 9: Confirm Cancellation

- Adobe will ask you to verify your identity
- You may be asked to select a reason for canceling (any option works)
- You may see discount offers—these can be skipped

Continue following the on-screen instructions until you reach the **confirmation screen**.

## Step 10: Trial Access Continues Until Expiry

Once canceled:

- You **will not be charged**
- You can still use Photoshop until the **7-day trial period ends**

## PHOTOSHOP HOME SCREEN OVERVIEW

The Photoshop Home screen is your starting point. It's designed to help you quickly access files, tools, tutorials, and creative resources—all in one place.

### Launch Photoshop

When you open Photoshop, the **Home screen** appears automatically. This screen gives you an overview of what's new and what you've been working on.


### Explore What's on the Home Screen

The Home screen includes several helpful sections:

- **Feature Highlights** – Stay up to date with the latest Photoshop updates and new tools.
- **Tutorials** – Learn essential concepts, workflows, tips, and shortcuts directly inside Photoshop.

- **Recents** – Quickly open your most recent cloud documents, including files shared with you.
- **Keyword Filters** – Search and filter your cloud documents by name or keyword. When you're offline, cloud-only files appear greyed out.

Photoshop also displays **personalized content** here, tailored to your experience level and Creative Cloud subscription.



## Return to the Home Screen Anytime

While working on a document:

- Click **Home**  in the Options bar to return to the Home screen.
- Press **Esc** to exit the Home screen and return to your open document.

## Use the Main Home Screen Buttons

At the top of the Home screen, you'll find quick-access options:


- **New File** – Create a new document using preset templates.
- **Open** – Open an existing Photoshop file.
- **Home** – Return to the Home screen at any time.
- **Learn** – Access guided tutorials for beginners and advanced users.
- **Your Files** – Browse and manage all your stored documents.

## Manage Your Files Efficiently

Under **Your Files**, documents are organized into clear categories:

- **Shared with You** – Files that others have shared with you.
- **Lightroom Photos** – Synced Lightroom images ready to be imported into Photoshop.
- **Deleted** – Files removed from cloud storage, with options to restore or permanently delete them.

## PHOTOSHOP WORKSPACE: UNDERSTANDING THE INTERFACE, ZOOMING, AND PANNING



A. Application bar B. Panels C. Tools panel D. Document window E. Options bar F. Notifications

When you're new to Photoshop, learning the workspace early makes everything easier. Once you understand where tools live and how to move around your image, editing becomes faster, smoother, and far less intimidating.

### Step 1: Understand the Document Window

At the center of the screen is the **Document Window**.



This is your main canvas—the area where you view and edit your image. Every adjustment, brush stroke, or design change happens here.


## Step 2: Explore Panels on the Right

On the right side of the workspace, you'll see **panels** such as **Layers**, **Properties**, **Color**, and **Swatches**.



These panels help you control and manage different aspects of your project.

- Panels are grouped together using tabs
- Click a tab to switch between panels in the same group
- For example, click **Swatches** to view colors, then click **Color** to return



If a panel is missing, you can reopen it anytime.

### Step 3: Open Hidden Panels from the Menu

To show a panel that isn't visible:

1. Go to the **Window** menu at the top
2. Click the panel name you need (for example, **Brushes**)


This ensures you always have access to the tools relevant to your work.

### Step 4: Reset the Workspace if Needed

Panels can be moved, resized, or closed.

If things get messy, you can reset everything:


1. Click the **Workspace** button in the upper-right corner



2. Select **Reset Essentials**

This restores Photoshop to its default layout.

### Step 5: Use the Toolbar on the Left



On the left side of the screen is the **Toolbar**.

This contains all the core tools for painting, selecting, retouching, and navigating your image.

- Hover over a tool to see a tooltip explaining what it does
- Some tools are grouped together—look for a small triangle in the corner
- Click and hold a tool to reveal others in the same group
- Click to select the tool you want to use

### Step 6: Adjust Tools Using the Options Bar

Above the Document Window is the **Options Bar**.




This bar changes depending on the tool you select.

For example:

- Select a **Selection Brush**, and you'll see options like brush size
- Choose a different tool, and its specific settings appear instead

Each tool has its own customizable controls here.

### Step 7: Use the Contextual Task Bar



The **Contextual Task Bar** is a floating, smart menu that shows the most relevant next steps based on what you're doing.

- Working with text? You'll see font and size options
- Drawing shapes? You'll see fill color, stroke color, and stroke width

It updates automatically as your task changes.

### Step 8: Zoom In and Out of Your Image

To work accurately, you'll often need to zoom.

1. Select the **Zoom Tool** from the Toolbar
2. Click on the area you want to zoom into



3. Drag right to zoom in
4. Drag left to zoom out

This helps you focus on fine details or see the full image.

### Step 9: Pan Around the Image

Once zoomed in, you'll need to move around the canvas.

1. Select the **Hand Tool** from the Toolbar
2. Click and drag to move across the image


This allows you to work on different areas without changing zoom levels.

## PHOTOSHOP WORKSPACE PREFERENCES EXPLAINED


Workspace Preferences control how Photoshop's interface looks and behaves. These settings help you customize panel behavior, document layout, and overall workspace organization.

### Open Workspace Preferences

Go to **Edit** → **Preferences** → **Workspace**.



This section focuses entirely on layout and interface behavior.



## Auto-Collapse Iconic Panels

- **Unchecked:** Panels stay open until you manually close them.
- **Checked:** Panels automatically collapse when you click anywhere else.

**Best for:**

- Keep **unchecked** if you frequently switch between panels.
- Check it if you prefer a cleaner, more minimal interface.

### **Auto-Show Hidden Panels**

- When **enabled**, panels temporarily appear when you move your cursor to the edge of the screen.
- When **disabled**, panels stay hidden until you open them manually.

**Recommended:** Keep this option **checked** for faster access to hidden panels.

### **Open Documents as Tabs**

- **Checked:** Images open as tabs at the top of the workspace.
- **Unchecked:** Images open as floating windows.

#### **Best for:**

- **Tabs:** Working on one image at a time.
- **Floating windows:** Comparing multiple images side by side.

### **Enable Floating Document Window Docking**

This option only applies if you use floating windows.

- **Checked:** Floating documents can be dragged and snapped back into the tab bar.
- **Unchecked:** Floating windows stay separate and cannot be docked.

**Tip:** Enable this if you switch between tabbed and floating layouts.

### **Large Tabs**

- Makes tabs and some panel items (like Color, Swatches, and Gradients) slightly larger.
- This is a subtle visual change.

**Recommended:** Keep it **checked** for better visibility.

### **Align UI According to OS Settings**

- Matches Photoshop's interface direction to your operating system.
- When off, Photoshop uses Adobe's default UI alignment.

**Optional:** Turn this on if you want Photoshop to visually match your OS layout.

### **Enable Narrow Options Bar**

Found under **More Options**.

- Reduces the height of the Options Bar.
- Useful for smaller screens or limited workspace.

**Recommended:** Leave unchecked unless screen space is tight.

### **Restore Default Workspaces**

Click **Restore Default Workspaces** to reset all custom workspace layouts.

You can also:

- Go to **Window → Workspace**
- Choose presets like **Essentials, Graphic and Web, Motion, or Painting**
- Use **Reset Essentials** to quickly restore the default layout

### **Final Tip**


If your workspace becomes cluttered or confusing, resetting it through **Preferences** or **Window → Workspace → Reset Essentials** is the fastest way to start fresh.

## **HOW TO FIND MISSING TOOLS AND CUSTOMIZE THE TOOLBAR IN PHOTOSHOP**


Photoshop lets you fully customize your toolbar—so if a tool is missing or your workspace feels cluttered, you can fix it in minutes. Here's how to find hidden tools, reorganize them, and even save your own toolbar layout.

### **Step 1: Open the Toolbar Editor**

1. Look at the **bottom of the toolbar** and click the **three dots (⋮)**.




2. Click **Edit Toolbar**.
3. A new panel opens:
  - **Left side:** Tools currently visible in your toolbar.
  - **Right side:** Hidden or unused tools.



## Step 2: Find and Add a Missing Tool

- If a tool (for example, the **Remove Tool**) is missing:
  1. Locate it on the **right-hand side**.
  2. Click and drag it into the toolbar area on the left.





3. Drop it where you want it.

- If you place it **outside any group**, it appears as a **standalone tool**.
- Click **Done**, and the tool immediately becomes available.

### Step 3: Group Tools the Way You Want

If you prefer tools to be grouped (as they are by default):

1. Click the **three dots (⋮)** again → **Edit Toolbar**.
2. Drag the tool into an existing group (for example, the **Spot Healing Brush** group).



3. Adjust its position within the group by dragging it up or down.
4. Click **Done** to apply the changes.


#### Step 4: Reorder Tools Inside a Group

- Open **Edit Toolbar** again.
- Drag a tool within its group to move it higher or lower.
- This changes the order in which tools appear when you click and hold on that group.

#### Step 5: Remove Tools You Don't Use

Unused tools take up space, so feel free to remove them:

- Examples of tools you might not need:
  - History Brush
  - Art History Brush
  - Paint Bucket Tool
- Simply drag unwanted tools **out of the toolbar** and into the hidden tools area.




Once done, click **Done** and enjoy the extra space and cleaner layout.

#### Step 6: Reset the Toolbar to Default

If things get messy:

1. Click and hold the **three dots (⋮)**.

2. Select **Edit Toolbar**.
3. Click **Restore Defaults**.



4. Click **Continue** to confirm.

Your toolbar instantly returns to Photoshop's original layout.

### Step 7: Save Your Custom Toolbar as a Preset


If you've created a toolbar layout you like:

1. Open **Edit Toolbar**.
2. Click **Save Preset**.
3. Give it a name (for example, My Preset).
4. Click **Save**.

You can now:

- Reset to defaults anytime
- Click **Load** and restore your custom toolbar instantly

### Step 8: Switch Between One-Column and Two-Column Toolbars



- Click the **double-arrow icon** at the top of the toolbar:
  - One click → **single-column toolbar**
  - Click again → **two-column toolbar**

Choose whichever layout feels more comfortable.

### Final Tip: Using the Remove Tool

Once the **Remove Tool** is visible:

- Draw a loop around the object you want to remove.
- Photoshop automatically removes it from the image.

## KEYBOARD SHORTCUTS IN PHOTOSHOP

Using keyboard shortcuts can dramatically speed up your workflow and make editing feel more natural and efficient.

### How to View Keyboard Shortcuts

You can view the complete list of keyboard shortcuts directly inside Photoshop:

1. Open Photoshop.
2. Go to **Help** in the top menu.
3. Select **Keyboard Shortcuts**.

This allows you to explore, learn, and customize shortcuts based on your workflow.

## Essential Photoshop Keyboard Shortcuts

### General Photoshop Shortcuts

Action	Windows	macOS	Description
<b>Copy</b>	Ctrl + C	Cmd + C	Copies the selected item or layer
<b>Paste</b>	Ctrl + V	Cmd + V	Pastes content from the clipboard
<b>Cut</b>	Ctrl + X	Cmd + X	Cuts the selection and copies it
<b>Undo</b>	Ctrl + Z	Cmd + Z	Reverses the last action
