Then go soft. Not every page needs to scream. Pastels and watercolor washes can make a moment feel like the breath right before the chorus hits.

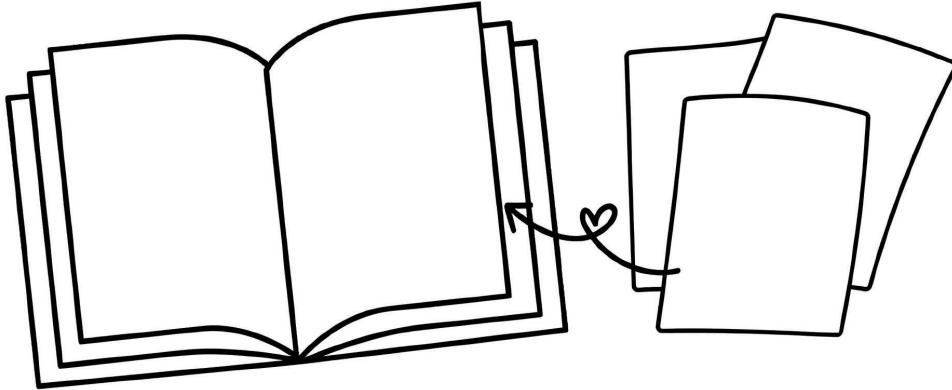
Mix your media. Gel pens for sparkle. Markers for punch.

Colored pencils for those "I'm taking my time" days.

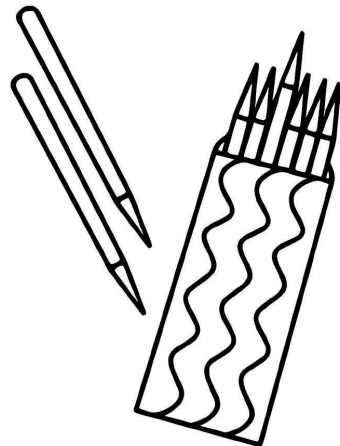
Metallic anything for stage lights and sword blades.
