WATERFRONT MANSIONS

286 ZEKI PAŞA MANSION

Rumeli Hisarı Mh. Balta Limanı Hisar Cd. 16 Sarıyer © With the giant Fatih Sultan Mehmet Bridge suspended above it, the Zeki Paşa Yalısı is a magnificent 19th-century baroque palace with a polygonal stone façade and arched windows. Built by Alexandre Vallaury, the Ottoman field marshal Müşir Zeki Paşa sadly only slept in one of his 19 bedrooms for a single night before being exiled.

287 FAIK AND BEKIR Mansion

Yeniköy Mh. Daire Sk. Sarıyer ⑥ This yalı (waterfront mansion) was designed by architect Raimondo D'Aronco between 1890 and 1895 abiding to an art nouveau aesthetic with plenty of ornamentation present on its shining white double façade. The home was originally built for Sara Sultan's two daughters but was later sold to Faik Kurtoğlu and Bekir Sıtkı Oyal and befittingly renamed.

346 CHRIST HILL — BURGAZADA

Burgazada Mh. Follow dirt path past Büyük Çamlık Sk. Adalar ® A sense of penetrating serenity is inevitable when you reach the top of Burgazada overlooking the expanse of the sea and horizon. The Hristos Tepesi (Christ Hill) was once home to a Byzantine monastery, but nowadays only ruins and a small 19th-century church remain, as well as the fascinating Greek cemetery amid the pines.



347 YAVUZ SULTAN SELIM MOSQUE

Built between 1522 and 1529, this mosque is dedicated to the infamous Selim I who killed more than a few of his family members in order to guarantee his and his son Süleyman the Magnificent's ascension to the throne. Located on Istanbul's fifth hill, the mosque's terrace looks out over a gorgeous Golden Horn view.



Rumelifeneri Mh. Sarıyer ⑥ Located on Istanbul's northernmost point, the quiet fishing village of Rumeli Feneri, with its casual seafood eateries, is a wonder completely removed from city life. The nearby 17th-century Rumeli Feneri Castle, built by Sultan Murad IV for surveillance purposes, looks out over the wild open sea.

456 FROM KURUÇEŞME To bebek

Beşiktaş 4

The waterfront boardwalk on the Europeside coast of the Bosphorus extends about 5 km from Kuruçeşme all the way to Rumeli Hisarı (with a few interruptions on the way). If you'd rather go for a shorter run, the route from Kuruçeşme to Bebek is around 3 km and can be rewarded with a delicious breakfast at Bebek Kahve.

457 **BY THE GOLDEN HORN**

Fatih (2)

458 THROUGH Maçka Park

Sisli (3)

This is a shorter run that takes you across the Atatürk Bridge (make sure to enjoy a glorious view of the Golden Horn on both sides) and continues up the coast, toward Balat, on the boardwalk until reaching the small Fener ferry port and then back (about 6 km in total, there and back).

Maçka Park is not very big, stretching about 1 km from one end to the other, but can be a tad more arduous because of its hilly landscape. If you're looking for a longer route, you can run up and down the smaller paths that lead around the park's wooded areas.

459 **BY THE MODA SEAFRONT**

Kadıköy (7)

Almost the entirety of the coast that surrounds the Moda area is a boardwalk where people love to run, stroll and ride their bikes. This particular run can go on for about 3 km in one direction and is accompanied by beautiful Bosphorus views the entire time.

460 BELGRAD FOREST

Bahçeköy Merkez Mh. Sarıyer ⑥ +90 212 226 13 14 Once a village that housed the thousands of Serbs who were brought to Istanbul after the Ottoman Siege of Belgrade in 1521, the Belgrad Forest is now a verdant paradise of deciduous trees with hidden historic ruins. It also has a more than 6 km running and walking path through nature.



5 unique NEIGHBOURHOOD NAMES and their meanings

486 **KADIKÖY**

Kadiköy

Continuously settled since prehistoric times, Kadıköy received its ancient name of 'Chalcedon' when it was settled by the Greeks in around 685 BC. After the Ottoman conquest, Chalcedon, which was a rural settlement at the time, was given to the first *kadı* (Ottoman judge) Hıdır Bey and was befittingly renamed, *Kadıköy* 'Village of the Judge'.

487 EMINÖNÜ Fatih

A centre of trade during the Ottoman era Eminönü was full of sailors and traders going about their business as well as many *Emin* (custom houses). The neighbourhood's name was thus directly derived simply from its position, *Emin önü*, meaning 'in front of the custom house'.

488 ARNAVUTKÖY
Beşiktaş

Arnavutköy, which translates to 'Albanian village', received its name when Sultan Abdülmecid, who was keen on simplifying the lives of pedestrians, had men from Albania brought to Istanbul in the 19th century in order to work on paving the city's streets.

489 **TARABYA**

Sariyer

During the Byzantine era, Tarabya became an area of healing due to its verdant nature and clean air and during the 5th century Patriarch Attikos befittingly renamed the neighbourhood Therapia (therapy in Greek). Over time, Therapia became Tarabya, a neighbourhood of historic architecture and excellent fish restaurants.

490 **FERIKÖY** Sisli

A historic neighbourhood with lovely old churches and houses, Feriköy was settled by the *Rum* (Greek Ottomans of Orthodox Christian faith) during the Ottoman era. It's believed to have been named after the French merchant Monsieur Ferri who had his mansion built there in the 18th century. Over time, *Ferri'nin Köyü* (Ferri's Village) became Feriköy.
