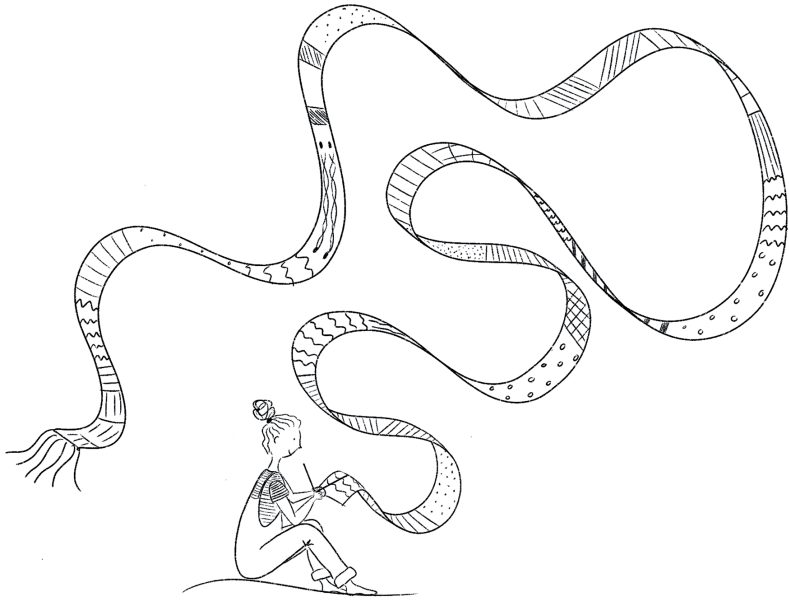


STORY TIME
