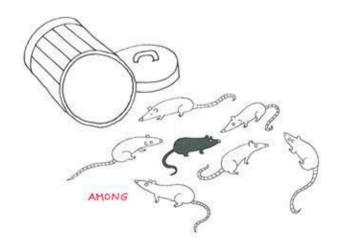
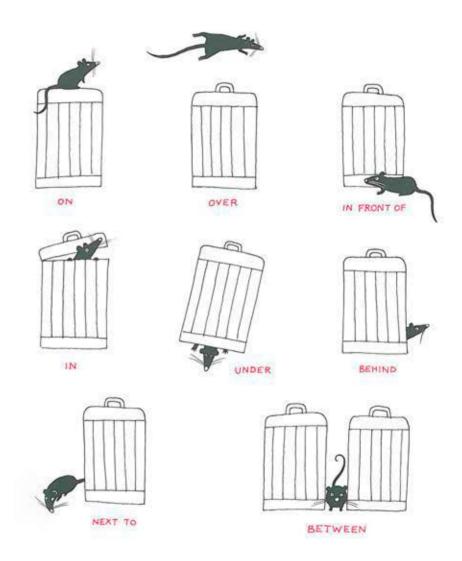

The SIMPLE PRESENT is used to make statements about the present time. For permanent facts that are always true: The night is dark. For present facts that are true now: I feel happy. For habitual actions: I get up late.



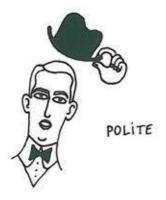
To make a Simple Past negative use: SUBJECT + DID NOT | DIDN'T + INFINITIVE without "to" I didn't go...

DID + NOT = DIDN'T





To make a Simple Past question use: DID + SUBJECT + INFINITIVE without "to" Did you love her?



DISHONEST





ARROGANT: having an exaggerated sense of one's own importance or abilities. BRAVE: possessing courage. CALM: not feeling nervous. CLEVER: showing sharp intelligence. CRAZY: affected with madness.







DISTRUSTFUL



OPTIMISTIC



ENTHUSIASTIC: having great excitement and interest. ENVIOUS: painfully desiring what someone else has. FRIENDLY: warm, comforting. FUNNY: causing laughter or amusement.

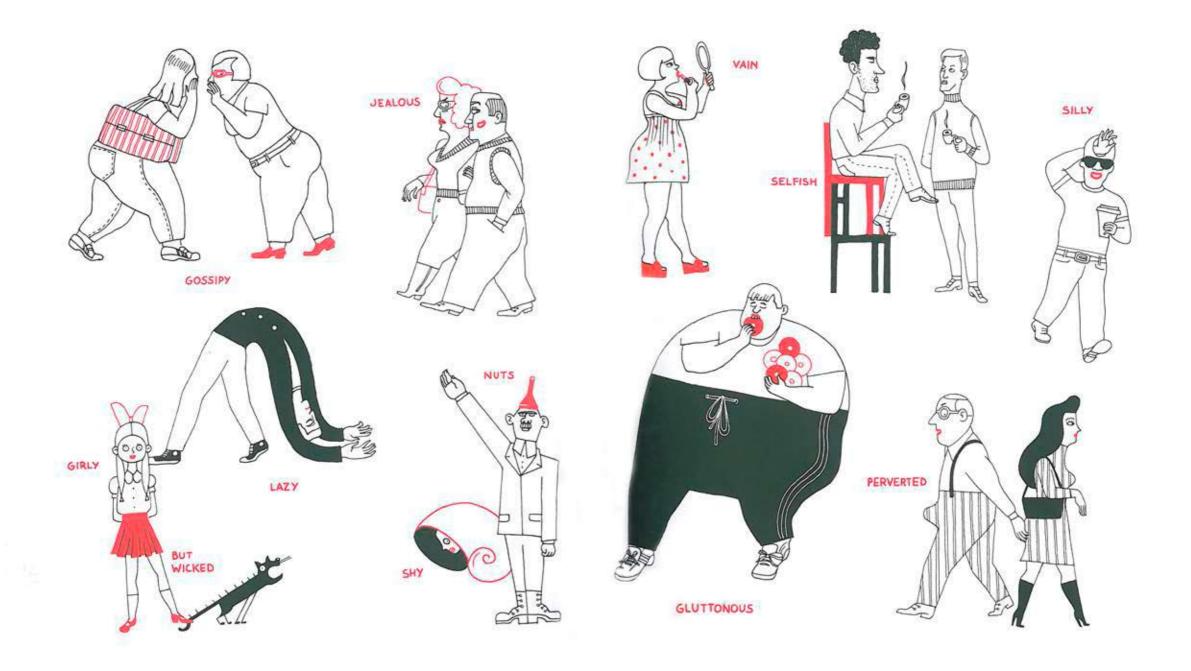
